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### Piano Section Rules

- 1 The Piano Section Rules should be read in conjunction with the Festival Rules. Please note important changes to 2026 Festival Rules relating to **late payment** and **own choice pieces**.
- 2 Solo piano class categories are defined as follows:
  - Non-competitive - those who fall within the parameters specified by the class
  - Beginner - up to 4 terms tuition on that instrument by 1 January
  - Intermediate - those who fall within the parameters specified by the class
  - Advanced - those who fall within the parameters specified by the class.
- 3 Entrants are permitted only one entry per Solo category (Non-competitive, Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced, Recital)
- 4 Grades referred to are from the ABRSM syllabus or equivalent.
- 5 The Beginner's Cup is awarded for the best performance in classes PN10 and PN11.
- 6 The Skelton Cup is awarded for the best Sonata performance in classes PN22 and PN23.
- 7 The Wey Trophy is awarded for the best performance in National music (classes PN38 - PN40).
- 8 The Anna Franklin Award of £25 is awarded for the most promising junior pianist (up to Year 11).
- 9 The Lucy Parham Trophy and Award of £50 will be given to the most promising pianist up to Year 13. Previous winners are not eligible, except in unusual circumstances.

### Adjudicators

#### Caroline Tyler (13 and 20 March)

British concert pianist Caroline Tyler has given concerts worldwide at venues including the Barbican Hall in London, Enka Auditorium in Istanbul, and the Martinu Hall and British Embassy in Prague. She works as a solo artist with City Music Promotions and Piha International.

Recent performances have included a double bill of Rachmaninov 2nd piano concerto at St Mary le Strand in London. As an honours graduate of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, she has been

invited to collaborate with the newly formed Guildhall Session Orchestra and Guildhall Session Singers on various new projects in London. In Sussex she has worked with Ensemble Reza to perform concertos in arrangements for chamber ensemble, and given recitals with duo partners including singers Rachael Lloyd and Charles Humphries and pianist Simon Watterton.



Caroline is the first prize winner of various competitions including the Anthony Lewis Memorial Prize, Anglo-Czech Trust Competition, Christopher Duke Piano Recital and Norah Sande Award. In music education, she is a member of the adjudication panel for the British & International Federation of Festivals (BIFF) and on the examiner panel for ABRSM. She enjoys teaching piano and composition to a small number of private students in her own studio and on residential music courses run by The 88 Education and Pro Corda. As a composer she has been commissioned and published by ABRSM and EVC Music, and had chamber music performed by Britten Sinfonia in Cambridge, and by the Isbourne Trio at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. She looks forward to giving further recitals including her own music at St Mary le Strand and St James's Piccadilly.

### Rebecca Cohen (22 March)

Rebecca Cohen is a Welsh collaborative pianist and educator, whose insight and performances have been described as “stylish, palpable and supportive... and a joy to absorb.” BBC Radio 3. She has performed across the UK and Europe, partnering leading artists including Joan Rodgers CBE, Benedict Nelson, Claire Barnett-Jones and Stephanie Wake-Edwards, appearing at prestigious venues such as Wigmore Hall, Muziekgebouw Amsterdam, the National Concert Hall Dublin, and Mozarthaus Vienna.

Recent engagements include a BBC Radio 3 broadcast as part of the Belfast International Festival of Chamber Music, the world premiere of a BBC Radio 3 commission for International Women's Day on BBC In Tune, and recitals as part of the Leeds International Concert Series and Drogheda Classical Music, broadcast on RTÉ Lyric FM. In 2025/26 Rebecca returns to the Wigmore Hall in recital with Claire Barnett-Jones.

Alongside her performance work she is committed to education and is currently a member of professorial staff at the Guildhall School, as well as at Junior Trinity Laban where she teaches 1-1 and leads piano performance classes. She is regularly engaged as an Adjudicator and External Examiner, including at the Royal College of Music, London and Trinity Laban Conservatoire, and has delivered workshops and masterclasses for organisations including EPTA and Wigmore Hall Learning.

Educated at the University of York, she completed her studies in collaborative piano at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama and later at the Franz Schubert Institut, Austria. She holds a PGCert in Performance Teaching in Higher Education, a Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy (HEA), and was made a Fellow of the Royal Society of the Arts (FRSA) in 2015.
